

Based on a cruel fairy tale by the Brothers Grimm restored to its original grimness after countless sugar-coated retellings and drawn and animated with meticulous care and great refinement, La Jeune Fille sans mains was triumphantly presented at the 2016 Cannes Film Festival and awarded a Special Jury Mention at the Annecy International Animation Festival. 
The Great History of Western Philosophy



JUMANJI

by **Joe Johnston** (USA, Canada, 1995) 104' (OV with Italian Subtitles)


Two brothers, Caleb and Benjamin Sproul, venture into the woods in the dead of night and fearfully bury a mysterious chest underground. When Benjamin asks what might happen to anyone who finds it, Caleb replies, "May God have mercy on his soul!" Once the chest is buried, the two flee on a cart. One hundred years later, in 1969, twelve-year-old Alan Parrish escapes from neighborhood bullies and takes refuge in his father Sam's shoe factory. After being beaten by the bullies, Alan hears a roll of drums among the excavations of a construction site and finds the chest buried by Caleb and Benjamin long ago. Opening it, he discovers a mysterious board game called Jumanji, which he brings home. From this moment, very strange things will begin to happen.



THE GAME

by **David Fincher** (USA, 1997) 120' (OV with Italian Subtitles)

Nicholas, a wealthy businessman from San Francisco, is given by his brother, for his birthday, a membership to an exclusive role-playing club called CRS. Although reluctant to accept his brother's proposal, Nicholas allows himself to be persuaded by the prospect of breaking the monotonous routine of his life and undergoes a series of tests conducted by the club. Some time later, Nicholas begins to notice sudden and suspicious changes in his life and hypothesizes that CRS has started its game. A game that turns out to be very dangerous. A skillful direction for a breathtaking thriller, with Fincher director.



Otesànek

by Jan Švankmajer (Czech Republic, Japan, 2000) 120' (OV with Italian Subtitles)

A couple, after learning they cannot have children, is desperate. To alleviate his wife's suffering, the husband carves a large piece of wood into the semblance of a child. The woman, who adopts it as if it were a son, begins to strongly desire that it become real. And the dream comes true, and the "mother" gives him the name Otik. But the newborn is not human and begins, within a few months, to grow more and more. The two "parents" have managed to keep Otik hidden from everyone, but little Alzbetka, the daughter of their neighbors in the building, discovers the truth.

To celebrate the 30th anniversary of Toy Story, the 24FRAME Future Film Fest, in collaboration with The Walt Disney Italy, presents a marathon of all four films.

Toy Story, the world's first fully CGI-animated film, is a cinematic milestone that tells the story of a toy cowboy, Woody (voiced by Tom Hanks in the original version and dubbed by Fabrizio Frizzi in Italian), and the other toys that inhabit the room of a boy named Andy.

Woody is Andy's favorite toy, making him the de facto leader of the other toys, who come to life whenever their owner leaves the room. On Andy's birthday, his toy friends—from Rex the dinosaur to Mr. Potato Head—worry that he might receive new toys that could replace them. Everything seems fine until Andy's mother brings out one final surprise gift: space ranger Buzz Lightyear.

John Lasseter received a Special Achievement Award at the 68th Academy Awards in 1996 for this groundbreaking film.




